Approval of Past Meeting Minutes (July 2021): Justin moved to approve the July 2021 minutes. Brien seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved when called for a vote.

Partner Reports

NRCS Report: Kara Vigneau gave a report to the group regarding NRCS activities since July.

CSFS Report: Ryan McNertney gave a report on CSFS activities in Grand and Summit Counties in 2021.

CSU Extension Reports: Dan gave a report on CSU Extension activities in Summit County, and Olivia gave a report on CSU Extension activities in Grand County.

MPCD Reports

DCT Report: Mark gave a report to the group regarding his activities since July.

DM Report: Katlin gave a report to the group regarding her activities since July.

Financial Report: The Financial Report was presented to the group. Justin moved to approve the financials (July thru September 2021). John seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved when called for a vote.

Old Business

FOLBR Soils/Carbon Sequestration: Katlin, Mark, and Kara reported on the FOLBR meeting they attended in July. FOLBR is looking to do a soils health and carbon study on 4 ranches in Summit County. The plans are still in their infancy, but MPCD has agreed to sponsor \$10,000 from the Summit County Commissioners to go toward this effort. The Summit BOCC's 2021 allocation to MPCD was earmarked for soils health and carbon sequestration. So far, this is the only project this year that has fit the bill for these funds.

Drought \$: Of the \$15,000 given to the District received from CSCB from Senate Bill 21-234, MPCD has given \$5,000 to Grand County for education related to the Grand County Drought Preparedness Plan.

2022 Matching Grant App: Katlin reported that she followed through with applying for the 2022 CSCB Matching Grant for the purpose of providing \$25,000 matching funds to the Grand County Wildfire Council for their chipping days and cost-share program.

2022 DCT App: Katlin also reported that she followed through with applying for the 2022 DCT program to maintain Mark for another year.

Community Survey & 2022-2024 Long Range Plan: Katlin presented the group with the 2021 Community Survey results (attached). She also presented a Draft 2022-2024 Long Range Plan to the group and asked for everyone to review it and provide input prior to the December meeting.

New Business

Summit County Weed Books: Katlin informed the group that she had received a request from the Summit County Weed Department for assistance in providing them more Summit County Noxious Weed Guides. As we do not have any more in stock, Katlin ordered some new and improved Summit County Weed Books using funds allocated for 'Education'.

CDA Drought Resiliency Grant App: Katlin reported that she applied for a \$25,000 matching grant from the Colorado Department of Agriculture's Drought Resiliency Fund for the purpose of funding an Irrigation Cost-Share Program in spring of 2022. We have yet to hear the results of our application.

Online Order Forms: Katlin informed the group that she has upgraded and revamped MPCD's order forms for seed and trees. We now have online order forms that will increase efficiency and convenience for buyers and the District.

BOCC Funds: Katlin reported that she, Kara and Mark had a great meeting with the Grand County Board of County Commissioners and that Grand County will be allocating \$7,500 to the District in 2022. Katlin also reported that she and John met with the Summit Board of County Commissioners, and Summit County will also be donating to MPCD in 2022. The amount from Summit County is yet to be determined, but we expect it to be close to \$10,000.

2022 Budget: Katlin presented the group with the Draft 2022 Budget. The Board will finalize the Budget at the December 7th, 2021, meeting.

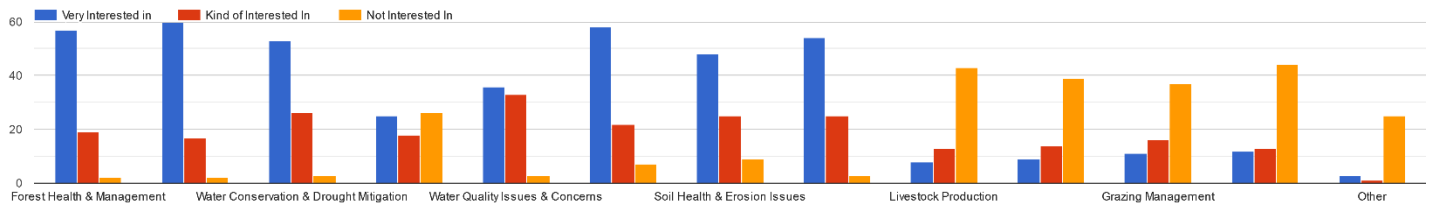

What natural resources conservation topics are you most interested in learning more about?



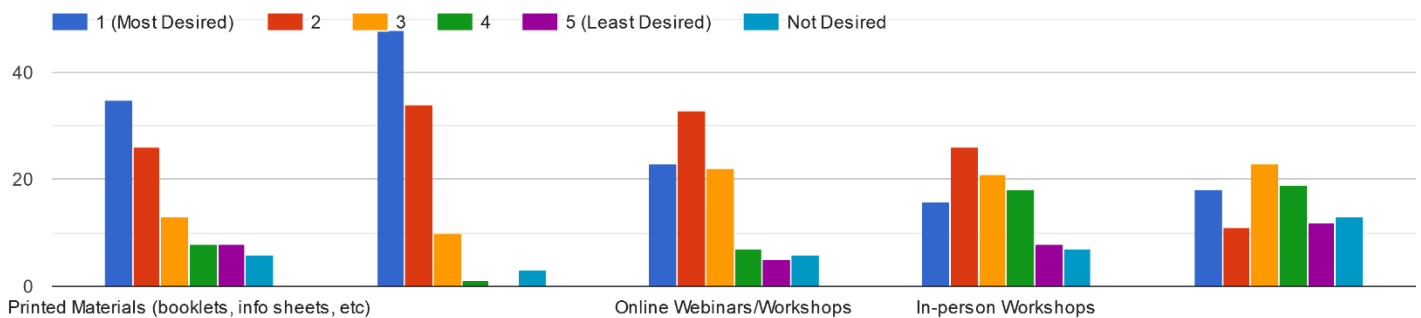

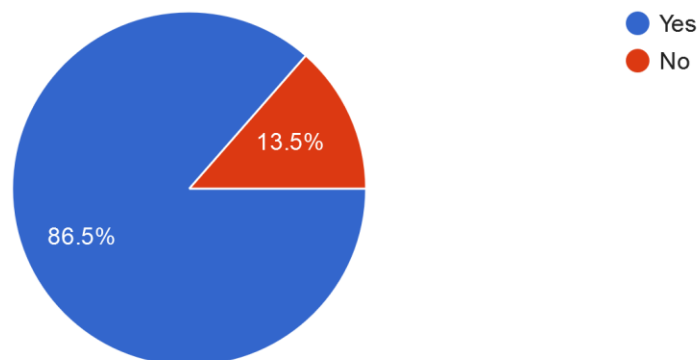
How do you prefer to learn about the topics you are interested in?

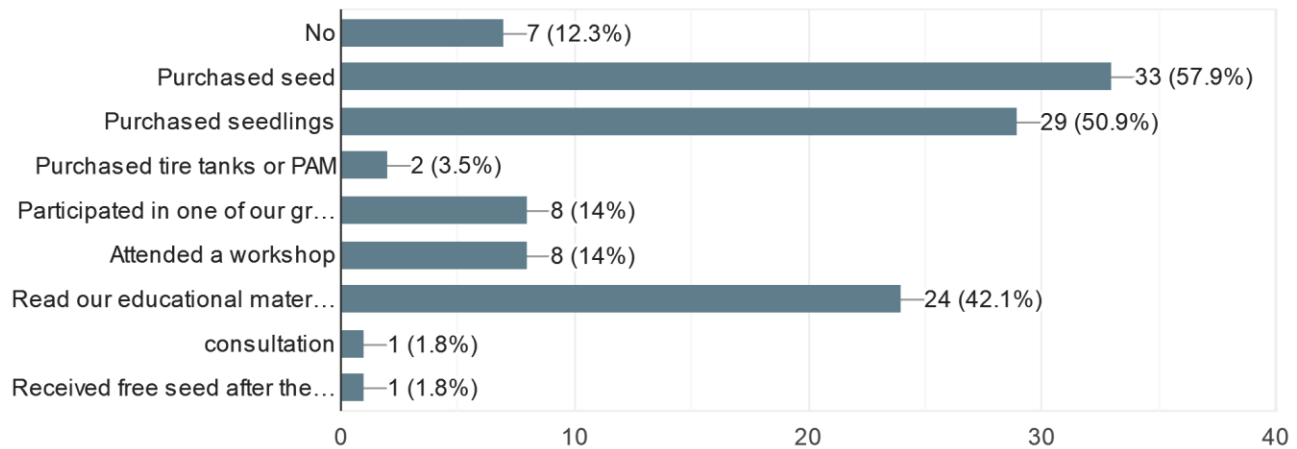

Have you used MPCD services or purchased products from us in the past?

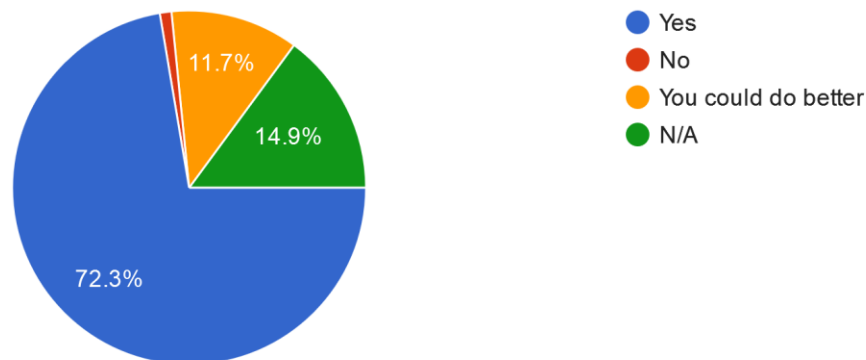

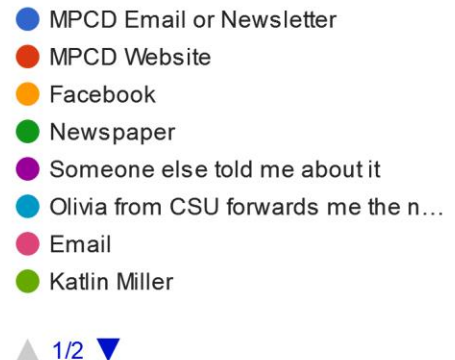
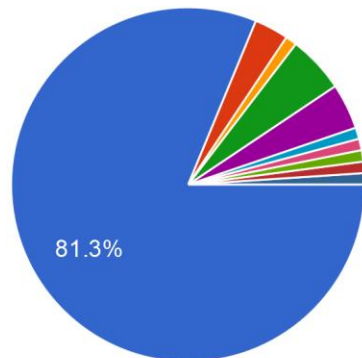

- Thank you for the seeds after the fire!!
- You have been helpful with seeding and replanting. Thank you.
- I was very impressed that you provided seed after the fire so that we could reseed our property
- thank you for your services.
- Do you have access to skidsteer mounted tree spade for relocating trees out of powerline easement?
- Very interested in re-foresting our property...have already re-seeded with grass seed from you. Now we need trees. How do we get them?
- Katlin is a rockstar!!!!
- You all provide an excellent service for our community.
- please place a high priority on managing land for wildlife habitat and public recreation
- Regarding the troublesome fire so much could have been done years prior. The challenge as I see it ,is governments inability to change. Locals all understood massive clear cutting was required to prevent last years catastrophe. My neighbors and I in Sun Valley spent close to 100,000 removing pine invested

trees. In the end it had little effect as Arapahoe Forest was mostly left alone and Rocky Mtn National Park did nothing. Even after all the destruction Grand lake will have a visual reminders for generation to see . In the end the Forest and Parks will continue with there environmental policies until the next big fire.

- We want to purchase tree seedlings for our lot. However, we're concerned about being able to water new plantings. If we order now and pick them up in the September window, do you think they would get enough natural moisture? We don't have access to water as we are just in the beginning stages of our rebuild at SunValley Lake.
