

- 1:30 second ad that follows directly after River Report
- 1 primetime spot every Monday-Sunday
- 2 best times available every Monday-Sunday
- Total of 5 ads per day or 35 per week

- 42,917 Targeted Display impressions per month
- 16,667 Geo-Fence impressions per month

Discussion on the Policy Book and Bylaws Update was postponed until the next meeting.

The Joint Chiefs Landscape Restoration Partnership

Katlin informed the Board that she recently received an email from Matt Kireker from Senator Bennett's office asking for support of the senator's Joint Chiefs Landscape Restoration Partnership. The Joint Chiefs Landscape Restoration Partnership is a collaboration/partnership between the Natural Resources Conservation Service and the Forest Service to work with ag producers and forest landowners to invest in conservation and restoration, ultimately improving climate resilience, reducing wildfire threats, protecting water quality and supply, and improving wildlife habitat for at-risk species, among myriad benefits.

Senator Bennet intends to introduce a piece of legislation in the coming weeks with Senator Hoeven (Republican from North Dakota) with the goal of seeing its reauthorization and extension included in the farm bill.

The Joint Chiefs Landscape Restoration Partnership is an initiative that has been around for nine years and has dozens of success stories, but it has yet to be extended and funded in a more meaningful fashion, which is what we're attempting to do this time around.
